Palm Sunday Gospel Reading

No one can know how the disciples felt in Gethsemane. On Passover they found themselves alone, frightened, praying in the dark for... escape, a miracle? Worse still their bodies

clamored for sleep, exhausted from the week's activities and anxiety. Here at this hour of the Master's great need, all they wanted was to sleep, to forget. Still they tried, tried to soldier on, praying until the lure of sleep was impossible to deny and slumber overcame them. Now each Holy Week, we mull over these nodding apostles, tsk-ing and critiquing their weakness. Yet, wait a moment. Are we not still in that garden, waiting and watching as an ever-darkening world threatens our faith, our church? And in this harsh hour of need, where is our vigilance, what watch do we keep over our Savior? Too often the world has reached out an evil hand and found the church slumbering. Too sluggishly we rise to combat the wickedness. It is time to hear again the battle cry of faith: Awake! Arise! Pray unceasingly! Today, as in ages past, the Savior is urging us, pray with me, keep watch in these dark hours. Will He find you sleeping?



This is one week in which we should not short-change God. He has given his life for us, so that we can live forever. We should observe this as a different kind of week, a truly HOLY week. We should participate in all of the reenactments of Jesus' last days before his death. If we spend time with him now, we can be certain that he will be there when we need him.



The Most Reverend Andrew H Cozzens invites all the faithful of the Diocese of Crookston to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception for the 2024 Chrism Mass at 6:30pm on Monday, March 25. Each year, the oils for

sacramental anointing used in the diocese are blessed at the Chrism Mass. These oils include: the oil of the infirm, used for the sick and dying to give them strength to bear their suffering, resist evil and obtain forgiveness for sin; the oil of the catechumens, used to give strength to renounce sin and the devil; and the Sacred Chrism, the chief anointing oil, used at Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination as Ordination as well as the anointing of altars and walls of churches being dedicated for Christian worship. Representatives will receive the blessed oils and take them to their parishes throughout the diocese. The priests of the diocese will also renew their promises to the bishop that evening. REFLECT

To a woman facing an unexpected pregnancy in difficult circumstances, adoption is sometimes felt to be worse than aborting her child. 





Jesus sent 2 of His disciples into the village to find a colt.




