

Gospel Reading

Stonemasons work amazing feats. Laboring with cumbersome blocks, the mason's art spans rivers and raises spiraling cathedrals. In arduous apprenticeship, these master workers

learn all the aspects of stone, its forms, uses, strength. And not least valued is the mason's ability to recognize a stone's innate weakness and adjust for it. A good mason places the right stones in their proper place to make the whole strong. It's the same with building faith. Think of Thomas. The ten disciples have seen the Lord, but honest Thomas doubts and says so. Yet when Jesus reappears, instead of rebuking Thomas, the Cornerstone builds up this slipping stone. With a touch of His healing mortar, Thomas' disbelief disappears into even deeper faith and he proclaims: my Lord and my God! Thus the faltering pebble became a rock of faith. And so it can happen for us. When our faith starts to crumble, and we're slipping through the cracks of doubt, God will patch our walls with stronger stone, if we only confess our fears. It's the art of masonry wielded by a Divine Hand: building a fortress of faith from the material at hand: pebbles, stones and boulders alike.



Today is Divine Mercy Sunday The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us — all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. The Divine Mercy message is one we can call

to mind simply by remembering ABC:

A - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

B - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

 ${\bf C}$ - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

★ <u>Adoration</u>: We have the opportunity to adore our Lord as we observe the Body of Christ in the monstrance. As you pray, or even sit silently before the Lord, you have time to take in the physical presence of the Lord before you—while you are looking at Jesus, Jesus is watching you. Adoration at St. Elizabeth's is held every Monday from 9:30am – 5:00pm. All are invited to visit; the amount of time you spend there is entirely up to you. You can also sign up as an Adorer or a sub for one of our scheduled Adoration times.
