Today's Reading
Nobody likes to suffer.
In fact, we do almost
anything to avoid
suffering. And yet
suffering comes to us
all, doesn't it? In many

kinds of suffering, we have no choice and can't avoid the problem; but when we do have a choice nine out of ten of us choose to keep our mouths shut. Why ask for trouble? In the Biblical teaching of Christ's second coming, the lines between Christ and the forces of evil will be drawn, and if we don't have the courage to stand for good, we will be controlled by evil. If we prepare our hearts by standing up for Christ in the small issues we face each day, we will be better prepared to take a stand when our very life is at risk. Remember practice makes perfect, and in this case, practice makes us prepared.

During the Month of All Souls (November), many parishes have the custom of giving a place of honor to a book in which community members and visitors write the names of their beloved dead. The Book of Remembrance was inspired by the ancient practice of recording the dates of the deaths of loved ones in a necrology, a public record or registry of death. This practice provides the living with an opportunity for healing and consolation in the face of grief. The Book of Remembrance is usually displayed from the solemnity of All Saints until the beginning of Advent. It is left open for people to write the names of their deceased loved ones and for others to read the names, remember, and pray for the repose of their souls. Our Book of Remembrance will be located at the entrance of the church on the pedestal.







