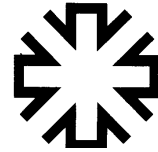

Today's Reading A precious guest is coming—now is the time to prepare! It is a season for cleaning houses and hearts, readying ourselves for the coming Messiah. Blow away the dust of apathy, scrub off the grime of selfish pursuits, shine the bright light of God's Spirit in every corner, purging the sin and stain away. Make the chambers a welcoming place of warmth and hope, charity and love, forgiveness and unity. Prepare for your King—He is coming soon. Maranatha!



Advent Wreath The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Three candles are purple, and one is rose. The purple candles symbolize prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over, and they are close to Christmas. The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. Any pinecones, nuts, or seedpods used to decorate the wreath also symbolize life and resurrection. Altogether, the wreath of evergreens depicts the immortality of our soul and the new, everlasting life promised to us through Christ, the eternal Word of the Father, who entered our world becoming true man and who was victorious over sin and death through His own passion, death, and resurrection.

Next week's special collection supports the **Retirement Fund for Religious**, which helps more than 20,500 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests who have spent their lives in service—many receiving little to no pay. Now, their communities struggle to meet their basic care, medication, and daily living needs. Your generosity ensures they can age with dignity. Please give in gratitude for their lifelong commitment.

Winter Weather Policy

In the event of significant winter weather, our policy will be keyed to other institutions in our community.

For example, on weekdays:

- 1) If the public schools have an early dismissal, all evening events or classes are likewise canceled for that day.
- 2) A 2-hour late start for the public schools means no morning Mass on that day, the parish Offices may open, but also 2 hours late (11 a.m.). Evening activities or classes will remain as regularly scheduled.
- 3) If the public schools are closed/canceled for the day, or have an e-learning day at home, there will be no morning Mass, and all evening activities or classes will be canceled.

For example, on weekends:

- 1) If the authorities issue a "no travel advisory," Sunday Mass will be canceled, and parishioners are to stay home and safe. It is well to spend some time in prayer as a family even if you are not able to attend Mass.
- 2) In all cases of severe weather closings and cancellations, every effort will be made to announce such on local TV and radio stations KVLV, KFGO, and WDAY, on Facebook and the parish website.

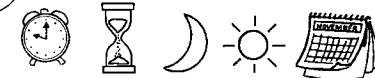

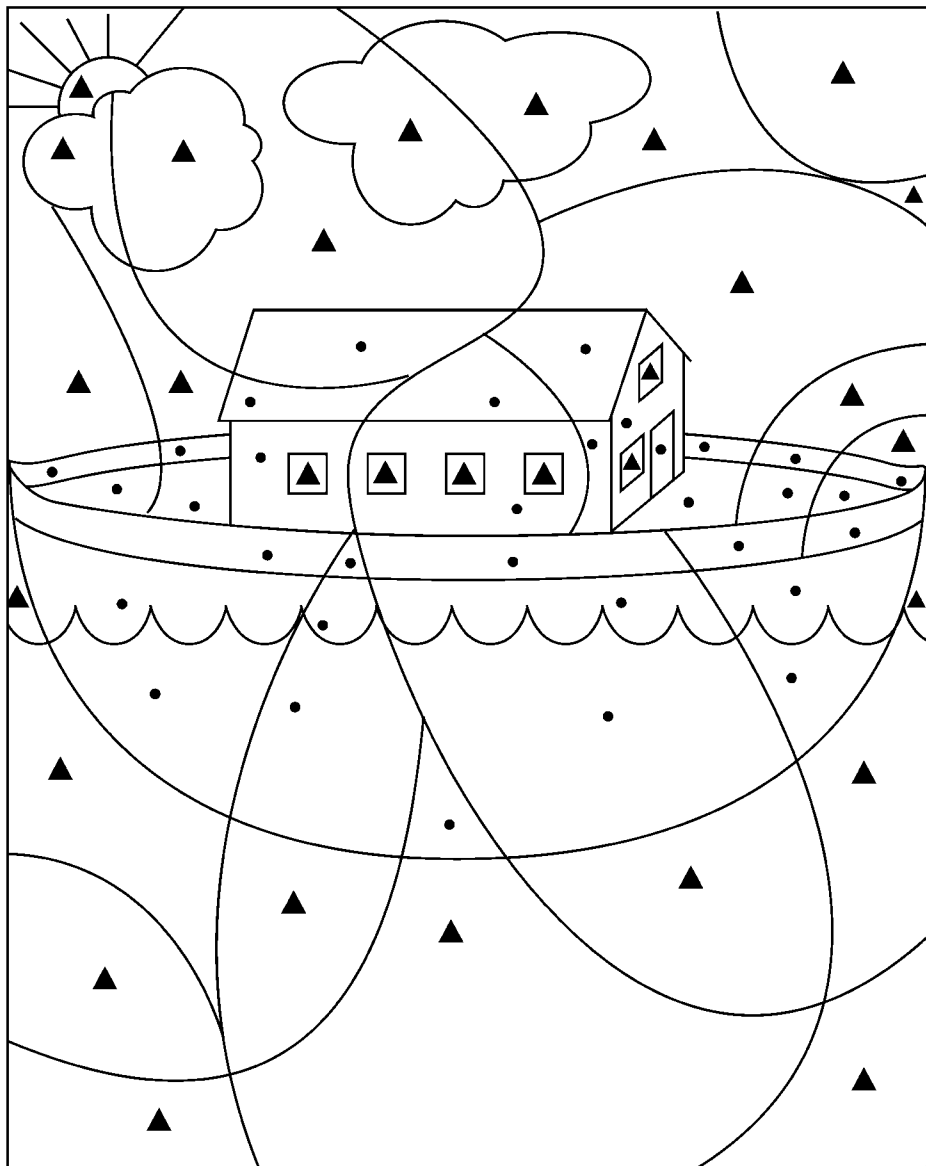

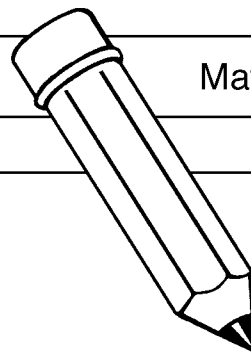
