Today's Gospel Reading

Like generations of Jews before him, John the Baptist grew up looking for the Messiah. Waiting, preparing his heart for the day God would send a Redeemer. But even as the “voice in the wilderness” John needed God’s guidance to recognize the Chosen

One. He was given a sign: “On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.” So John started on the long road of his ministry. He listened and heard God’s call to preach repentance, baptizing those who came with water. And John waited, watching for the sign, until the day his Messiah appeared on the banks of the Jordan. His obedience and faithful reading of the signs enabled John to fulfill God’s promise in his life. Just like John we need to be faithful watchers today. Take a moment to ask yourself: Have I heard God’s call to my special task in life? Am I busy on the banks of my Jordan? Am I watching for the coming of Jesus?

A Catholic Reflection: "Lending Our Hearts" in a Time of Tragedy

What God Might Think Scripture tells us that God is profoundly attentive to the shedding of human blood. In Genesis, God says, "The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground" (Gen 4:10). We can surmise that God views the death of anyone—and the fear in our immigrant communities—with the weeping eyes of Jesus.

In his reflection on November 21, Bishop Cozzens reminded us that "our citizenship is in heaven" (Phil 3:20). God sees the tragedy in Minneapolis through the lens of this eternal truth.

- **The Conflict of Realms:** While we live in an earthly realm with borders and laws, we belong to a heavenly realm that has none. God likely views the violence this week not just as a civic failure, but as a failure to recognize that every person—citizen or undocumented—is a potential "fellow citizen of the saints" (Eph 2:19).


- **Sorrow for Division:** As the Bishop noted, "Heavenly citizenship is more important than our earthly one." God weeps when earthly enforcement becomes an idol that crushes human dignity, or when enforcement actions lack the discernment necessary to protect the unity of the family, which is the domestic church.

What We Can Do as Human Beings We must act as citizens of heaven while living on earth:

- **Lend Our Hearts (Compassion):** Bishop Cozzens calls us to "Lend Our Hearts" to Jesus so we can love with His "tender compassion." We must reject "dehumanizing rhetoric" and instead see the face of Christ in the immigrant.
- **Advocate for Prudent Welcome:** Aligning with the Nov. 21 statement, we advocate for a "generous but prudent welcome." We support laws that maintain order but oppose indiscriminate mass deportation, which the Bishop warns creates a "climate of fear" and violates our duty to care for the vulnerable.
- **Practice Solidarity:** We must ensure our parishes are places of safety and welcome, refusing to dehumanize anyone—whether the victim or the agents—and seeking the truth that serves the Common Good.
- **Pray for Peace:** Above all, we must pray that our earthly laws increasingly reflect the justice of the City of God, where mercy and truth meet.


