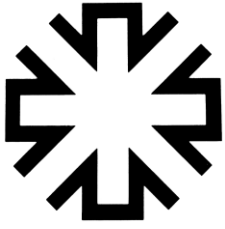

Red River Market

Our mission is to create a place where all people can experience the joys of local, fresh food. We’re excited to share that the SNAP Double Bucks program is back for the season! This initiative allows individuals using SNAP benefits to double their dollars at the market. Each person who swipes their EBT card can receive up to \$15 in Double Bucks per market day, meaning they’ll have \$30 to spend on qualifying local produce. Double Bucks never expire and can be carried over to the next market if they’re not all used on the same market day. We have also partnered with MATBUS to offer free rides to and from the Red River Market from July 11th through October 31st. They are valid from 9 am to 3 pm on market days. These programs help ensure that all members of our community— regardless of income—can enjoy locally made produce, meats, and more. The market will be at 201 Broadway, Fargo, from 10 am – 2 pm, Saturday, July 11, Sunday, July 19, and Saturdays July 25 – October 31.

I am writing to share an important update with you regarding my pastoral ministry and our ongoing path forward as a parish family.

On May 26th, I had a very fruitful conversation with Bishop Cozzens about the long-term spiritual health of our parishes and my own capacity to lead us from maintenance to mission.

As you know, I was blessed to take a sabbatical last Fall. Returning from my sabbatical directly into the intense demands of running two parishes led to severe pastoral burnout. I have been actively addressing this since late March, and Bishop Cozzens, the parish staff, and others have been most helpful.

Bishop Cozzens has approved a proactive plan for me to take the month of July to operate on a modified, reduced pastoral schedule to more fully recover and retool.

I want to be very clear and offer you peace of mind: I am not stepping away from our parishes. This temporary situation is meant for me to step back so as to be able to come back better equipped for the inevitable challenges of priestly ministry.

Here is what you can expect during the month of July:

- **Continuing Sacramental Care:** I will continue to offer Sunday Mass and daily Mass, and I will remain available for any emergency visits and funerals.
- **Reduced Office Hours:** To allow my mind and body to recover from chronic stress, I will be spending minimal time in the parish office (only a few hours per week).

A natural question is, “how will things function on a day-to-day basis?” The answer: I will be here in Dilworth, “working from home.” For the month of July, if you have routine parish needs or scheduling questions, please contact the parish office, and our dedicated team will assist you, as always.

I am deeply grateful for the guidance of Bishop Cozzens and the incredible dedication of our parish leadership who are stepping into the gap. I ask for your continued prayers for my health, just as you are always in mine. Let us continue to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance as we build a vibrant future for St. Elizabeth and St. Andrew.

Our parishes have been conditioned by an old "Christendom" model that no longer effectively proclaims the Gospel in our rapidly changing culture. We are in the midst of a crucial transition—the Diocese's New Life Planning for Mission initiative—which calls us to shift from mere maintenance to mission.

However, navigating this new reality requires a fundamental change in how we view leadership within the Church.

In the Church's Canon Law, the obligations of a pastor are frequently described using the Latin word *curare*, which means "to see to it" or "to take care". For generations, many interpreted this to mean that the pastor must do it all himself. But the law distinguishes between *pastoral governance* and *practical execution*. My canonical and spiritual duty is to *see to it* that the Word of God is proclaimed, that the Eucharist is the center of our assembly, and that the parish's temporal goods are handled properly. It is a duty of solicitous *oversight*; the pastor is meant to be the architect and supervisor of the pastoral mission, not its sole laborer.

The Second Vatican Council heavily emphasized a model of co-responsibility. The Lord has given each of you incredible, unique charisms, and you have an indispensable role to play in the life of the Church. The Divine Renovation model we are studying explicitly calls for shared leadership so that the pastor can focus on his primary vocation of spiritual fatherhood and vision-casting, while empowering the laity to execute the ministries they are gifted for.

This delegation is not a temporary fix; it is the beginning of our "new normal". By truly sharing this leadership, we ensure that our parishes can thrive and that I can serve you joyfully and effectively for years to come.

Please continue to pray for me as I recover and let us pray together for the Holy Spirit's guidance as we build a vibrant, mission-centered future for St. Elizabeth and St. Andrew.

Hello Saint Elizabeth Families,
In April, Fr. Augie wrote to families in our Religious Education Programs (now Youth and Discipleship Programs) announcing A New Vision for Faith Formation at St. Elizabeth's.

This will mean making changes for the coming school year to support the Diocese's vision of having a Family-Centered Faith Formation. With this vision, we will be shifting our programming to have parents or another faith-practicing adult attend classes with their child. We will be meeting once a month during the below listed dates.

Please note that ALL grades will be meeting Sundays. Grades Pre-K through sixth grade will be meeting right after mass at 9:30a-10:30a and grades seventh through eleventh will be meeting 5:30-7:00p. We are still working out the details for Sunday evenings but we would like to offer supper so we can have great conversations and hear about God at the same time. If you would be willing to be part of a group that helps with meals, please contact Kaylie as soon as possible.

Grades ninth, tenth, and eleventh will be eligible to prepare for Confirmation this year as we move with the Diocese to make Confirmation available to those ready to fully embrace their faith, even at an earlier age. In the 2027-2028 school year, those in grades eighth and ninth will be eligible, once they have worked with their parents along with the parish staff, and discerned if they are ready to take this serious step.

Remember, in the new diocesan framework, the vision for Christian Initiation shifts away from treating the sacraments as a "graduation" checklist, shifting the focus instead on leading youth to a genuine, life-changing encounter and relationship with Jesus Christ. The ultimate goal is for young people to actively choose to complete their Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) so they can fully activate the Holy Spirit's unique gifts. This means that there is an active "discernment" of readiness—one can "opt-in" as early as ninth grade (in future, 8th grade) but it is not "automatic"; you and your child, along with the parish staff, may faithfully conclude that it would be better to wait to a later time to prepare.

We would like to stress that Sunday and Holy Day Mass attendance is the absolute bedrock and cornerstone of our living faith. The expectation will be that whether at St. Elizabeth's or another parish, you and your son/daughter are regularly attending Mass weekly.

We will continue to share additional details throughout the summer. Please look for those announcements in the monthly Parish Bulletin and in our BAND app in the "St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church" group. Praying that you have a blessed and joy-filled Summer!

The Catholic Parishes in Moorhead, Minnesota (St. Joseph's & St. Frances de Sales), under the pastoral leadership of Fr. Vincent Miller, seeks a full-time **Director of Youth and Family Formation** to lead religious formation of youth and their families. The Director will be responsible for implementing a new model of youth formation that involves family-based formation of children and mentorship focused formation of early and older youth. These parishes are embarking in a new approach to faith formation guided by Bishop Andrew Cozzens' pastoral letter *New Life Through the Tender Compassion of our God* which calls for fostering encounter with Jesus and His Church in a small group environment.

The director will work with parents and adult youth mentors in offering a three-phase formation ministry which is made up of: *Encounter* (for 2nd through 5th grade parishioners and their families), *Discipleship* (small group formation for middle school aged parishioners leading toward the Sacrament of Confirmation in the 8th grade year), and *Witness* (Mentor-based small group formation to prepare high-school youth to be missionary disciples of Jesus and active in the life of His Church.). Within this three phase model, the Director will foster evangelization of families with young children as well as provide for youth activities. The Director will supervise the Evangelization Associate who will assist the Director in these ministries.

Qualifications

- Must be a practicing Catholic, fully aligned with the Church's mission.
- A bachelor's degree in religion, ministry, human services or other related area.
- Prior ministry experience in faith formation, evangelization, or forming disciples.
- Must be well-organized, able to multitask and effectively work in a changing environment
